-  Type: Deciduous Tree
-  Height: 60 - 80'
-  Spread: 40 - 50'
-  Form: Rounded
-  Growth Rate: Medium
-  Life Expectancy: Long
-  USDA Zone: 3 - 8
-  Root Pattern: Deep Lateral
-  Sun: Full to Partial
-  Soil Texture: Sandy Loam to Clay, Tolerates most soils
-  Topography: Upland
-  Plant Community: Forest
-  Origin: MSA Zone 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, MN, N. America
-  Turns russet in the fall
-  Lumber has high value
-  Great for wildlife
-  Susceptible to oak wilt
-  Withstands city conditions
-  Leaves persist into winter
