


















Spruce, Norway

(Transplant)

-  Type: Evergreen, Conifer
-  Height: 80'
-  Spread: 20 - 50'
-  Form: Pyramidal, Cascading appearance
-  Growth Rate: Very Fast
-  Life Expectancy: Medium
-  USDA Zone: 3 - 7
-  Root Pattern: Shallow Lateral
-  Sun: Full
-  Soil Texture: Sandy Loam to Clay
-  Topography: Upland, Grows on Most Sites, Prefers
Moisture
-  Plant Community: Forest
-  Origin: Non-North America
-  Needle: Stiff, $\frac{1}{2}$ - 1" long, 4-angled but somewhat
flattened, with a sharp pointed tip, shiny deep green, each
needle borne on a raised, woody peg
-  Seed source is critical for winter survival
-  Largest and fastest growing spruce
-  Tree thins as it ages
-  Large cones often used in decorations
-  Highly valued ornamental and timber tree
