(Tall Tree)

-  Type: Deciduous Tree; Nut Tree
-  Height: 75 - 100'
-  Spread: 75 - 100'; Broad Crown
-  Form: Irregular
-  Growth Rate: Moderate
-  Life Expectancy: Long
-  USDA Zone: 4 - 8
-  Root Pattern: Deep Lateral
-  Sun: Full
-  Soil Texture: Sandy Loam to Clay Loam; Deep; Rich Soil
-  Topography: Upland, Lowland (Flood Prone/Stable Water)
-  Plant Community: Forest, Savannah
-  Origin: MSA Zone 1, 6, MN, N. America
-  Edible Nut: Yes
-  Dark green leaves
-  Highly valued timber tree
-  Due to taproot, start with small trees or nuts
-  Roots produce material toxic to many plants
